Preschool and the importance of play

The major goal of the DSODE Preschool program is to develop each child's creativity, curiosity, skills and knowledge.

The program is based on the following.

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- Play is vital to the development of all children and is their way of learning about themselves and exploring the world around them.
- Play is essential for a child's basic development in all areas.
- Play is the way in which physical, emotional, social, thinking and language skills are gradually acquired and continue to develop throughout childhood.
- Participation in the variety of activities included in a Preschool program will allow the child to progressively develop a wide base of experience, skills and concepts.
- Future learning is built upon a quality Preschool learning program.

Criteria for enrolment Preschool Program

Children who turn four (4) before 31st July in the year of their enrolment in the Preschool and are either:

Isolated – living in an isolated area of NSW and at least three (3) kilometres from the nearest bus route to a public school (with a distance certificate signed by the Principal of the nearest public school); or

Travelling within Australia – travelling for an extended period of time; do not live in one place for more than six (6) weeks and can supply an itinerary six (6) weeks in advance throughout each school term; or

Temporarily Resident in PNG – without access to an English speaking preschool; holidaying for up to one (1) year or with parents who have been transferred for work commitments; have a NSW home address and are Australian citizens.

Medical – students with medical conditions which prevent them from attending a school the following year, may be eligible.



About the Preschool

Dubbo School of Distance Education (DSoDE) offers a distance education preschool program for isolated students from NSW and PNG who meet the criteria listed in this brochure.

Enrolment is limited to 48 children with priority given to those children continuing their K-6 schooling in a distance education school.

What does the DSoDE Preschool program involve?

The Preschool Program is:

- flexible, child-centred, fun and interest based
- · reliant upon supervisor (parent/carer)
 - engaging in activities and play experiences with their children
 - providing the teacher with feedback
- based on support and guidance from the preschool teacher.

How does the

Preschool program work?

- Parents/carers play a vital link in the preschool program by providing detailed feedback in both written and oral form to the teachers about their child's progress. Photos are an effective way of recording student participation in activities.
- Students receive their work in boxes and/or packs via the mail. The boxes and packs are designed to provide the child with a program that lasts three (3) or six (6) weeks. When a box or pack is completed the parent/carer returns it to the school. Prior to this the teacher will have sent the next box or pack so that the program can run continuously.
- The teacher provides feedback throughout the program and after assessing material returned to the school.
- Each student has a program designed for them to meet their interests and needs in all developmental areas.
- Various forms of field services are offered which enhance the learning program. These may include children, parents and carers participating in Dubbo camps and home visits.
- Parents/carers are supported in their role as home supervisors through phone calls, camps, email, written feedback and home visits where possible.

What is inside a box?

- Library books
- Craft materials
- Individually programmed activities and materials
- Listening books, music CDs, DVDs and Puzzles
 Educational equipment
- Matching and sorting games, construction kits etc.

What's a pack?

- · programmed activities
- personal message, listening books Library books and craft materials
- CDs/DVDs/Computer Games

Activities are:

- planned sequentially to allow for development of skills; intended to be REPEATED REGULARLY, and
- provided as suggestions only.
