A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Student Teacher:

Last Friday we farewelled our student teacher, Ellen Jamieson. Ellen had a wonderful time during her practicum, often commenting on the lovely behaviour of our students. We wish her well in her future as a school teacher, knowing that it will be a successful one, due to her positivity and enthusiasm.

PBL:

The Stage 2 & 3 students are well underway with their project based learning. All students are showing positive changes in their approach to their own learning, becoming more independent, remaining on task and engaging with eachother about their learning tasks.

Reports:

Stage 2 & 3 reports were sent out last Thursday, with Kinder and Stage 1 being sent out last Monday. Interviews are scheduled for tomorrow and Friday for Stage 2/3 (due to myself having to attend a family funeral in Hay). If you have any queries regarding your child's / childrens report, please don't hesitate to contact the school to set a time to speak to the appropriate teacher. Please keep in mind that interviews are only of a 15 -20 min duration, depending on the bookings.

Convict Experience:

Last week I put in an application for an overnight stay at the Hyde Park Convict Barracks Museum in Sydney, for Stages 2 & 3. The students would arrive late in the afternoon, be given a convict shirt and be assigned to a 'work gang' with an overseer. They would sleep in a dormitory of hammocks, just as the convicts did and would feast on 'convict type rations'. A night tour of the museum would be taken, along with being introduced to games played during the era. Such an experience would be second to none for our students, enabling them to experience first hand the life of a convict between 1819 - 1848. We have been successful with our application, which means that the cost of the visit is covered along with \$20 per student to assist with transport (every little bit helps). I am negotiating with the organisers for an appropriate date, possibly, term 4 and the cost of transport. Stay tuned!
