K-2 News:

K/1/2 has had a jam packed first half of Term 3! Rodney the Quokka is onto his 5th visit home and everyone is having a fantastic time with him! We have heard lots of exciting stories and seen some great photos! I thank you for your participation and enthusiasm! Home Learning has been going well, students are eagerly completing their work and having it back on time. I appreciate your support and encouragement, thank you!

In English we have been finding verbs and adverbs in our reading materials and brainstorming verbs we do in our everyday activities. Just a reminder if students can come with their home reader bags on Tuesday's so they can swap their readers for new ones.

In Maths we had fun solving subtractions word problems last week, students enjoyed figuring out how to solve the problem and developed clear working out strategies. This week we have looked at Mass, we found words we can use to describe the weight of an object and compare them to other objects. Using a pan scale we weighed objects around the classroom and measured them against a uniform informal unit.

In Science we have started looking at clouds. Students came up with four inquiry questions based on more information they would like to know. Over the next coming weeks we will work through these questions.

In PDHPE our Fun Friends program is in full swing. Students are having a fantastic time with our friends from Intereach and have been learning fantastic strategies. Each week students are sent home with a leaflet explaining what was discussed during the session, if you have not returned the information sheet can you please do so, thank you.

In Science and Technology this term, students will investigate the solar system and the Earth's place as part of a connected system. The focus question is 'what is the solar system?' Students will identify the location of the planets and learn about distances in space and astronomical units. They will research other celestial bodies within our solar system, including asteroids, meteorites and comets and will investigate strange phenomena, including the question of an expanding universe. Production practice is going well, I am pleased that the students are learning the songs and their lines which makes our practice sessions much more productive.

I am hoping that you have all received the notes I sent home in regards to costume requirements for your child/children for production. If not please let me know.
