

A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Check In Assessment: Last week our Yr 4 and Yr 6 students took part in the Check In Assessment program, which is a departmental method of monitoring each student's learning progress in between the years of the formal NAPLAN assessing. On a whole our Yr 4's did well, scoring above the State average in both Numeracy and Reading. Yr 6's were just a little behind in both areas, however all students have shown improvement in their learning across both domains.

Cybersafety: As the holiday period approaches I would like to draw your attention to creating a cybersafety environment when and if your child/ren are using electronic devices. Please make sure they are properly supervised when online and are understanding of their digital footprint. There are many nasties out there parading as young adolescents and luring in innocent young people, thinking they have found an online friend. Next term we will be focusing on this topic (Cybersafety), leading students through the resources that are available to them on their own Department Student Portal. Could I also remind parents / carers that mobile phones are **not permitted** at school.
